Post-Pandemic Library Use

With library buildings closed during the pandemic, Redwood City Public Library moved to curbside pickups and online programs. How has the pandemic altered library use now that all three libraries are back to full operation?

Ebook circulation was 16% of total checkouts prior to the pandemic. During the pandemic, ebook circulation jumped to 33%. In 2023, ebooks are 20% of total circulation. Some patrons learned they enjoy the convenience of ebooks while others (like your editor) returned to their favored paper copy.

Data show that the number of library visitors varies greatly by location. At the Downtown Library, monthly visitors are 48,000 versus 33,000 pre-pandemic, a 45% increase! However, Schaberg is down 19%, and Redwood Shores is down 50% in monthly visitor numbers. Thanks to the sizable increase at the Downtown Library, library visits overall have increased by 6% post-pandemic.


Interestingly, circulation (number of items checked out) is down at all three locations. Downtown

is 19% lower, with Schaberg and Redwood Shores both dropping by 31%. Across the three libraries, circulation is down an average 20%.

Redwood City's library staff grew very adept at creating online programs during the pandemic. Even now, with most programs in-person, a few programs that worked well online have continued in this manner. Children's book clubs, language discussion groups, author talks with non-local authors, and Little Learners craft programs all remain online.

The largest drop in use has been at Downtown's Teen Room. Prepandemic, the room averaged 450 visitors per month, but recently the average has been only 100 visitors. The library has expanded hours and is hiring a new teen librarian to promote the space.

This information about library use is a good reminder that we should spread the word that our library is fully back in operation and we should once again make full use of its impressive resources!
