Registration for all children, teens, and adults starts on June 1!

For everyone under 18 years of age, the registration process includes a free book of the child's choice. After completing the challenge, each child will be entered into a drawing for a \$1000 scholarship. Adults qualify for tickets for a prize drawing by reading a book, reading to a child, or attending a library class or program. Head to any of the three wonderful Redwood City libraries to sign up!

The learning challenge encourages kids and teens to read during the non-school months. That is only the beginning of its benefits. The program includes a wide variety of fun entertainment, Makerspace programs, storytimes in our libraries and Redwood City parks, book clubs, and so much more! Does your child love LEGO, sewing, drawing, magic, bubbles? There are programs centered on all these things! For adults, there are two music programs this summer at the library plus the ongoing programs in the Makerspace.

Summer Learning Challenge is the single largest program that Friends funds each year. Friends is very grateful to the hardworking and creative library staff who put together and manage this fine program. Last year, there were 9,643 registrations and 1,007 completions of the challenge. Downtown Library Bees

The Library bees went through a bit of a reset this spring. One of the three hives had been empty since last summer, one lost its queen and failed to raise another, and one had a failed swarm.

As a result, our beekeepers brought new bees and new queens for all three hives in April. Two of the hives started growing immediately, but the third queen didn't survive. Fortunately, the bees in the third hive were able to raise a new queen, but that hive is a few weeks behind in its growth. This time of year, the focus is on increasing the population, and all three hives are busily hatching and raising thousands of baby bees. There is a small amount of honey in the hives, but within the next few weeks the population of bees out foraging for pollen and nectar will grow dramatically, and they will start producing lots of honey. We expect a large honey harvest in the next several weeks - it's not an exact science to predict when, but three healthy hives should produce hundreds of pounds of honey by the end of summer.
