## **Spring at the Library**

#### National Library Week is April 6 -

12. This annual celebration highlights the valuable role libraries, librarians, and library workers play in strengthening our communities and transforming lives. Public libraries are community hubs that bring people together and close the opportunity gap by connecting people to essential services and resources.

Spring is a wonderful time to celebrate our libraries and attend some of their wonderful programs:

#### Interested in sustainability?

There will be three STEAM programs for children 9 – 12 on sustainability (3/29), water cycle (4/26), and the greenhouse effect (5/24), all at 2 p.m. For adults, there will be a program on reducing kitchen waste with Zero-Waste Chef Anne-Marie Bonneau on 3/29 and another on firescaping your home with two CSU Chico professors on 4/5. Plus, enjoy a Phase2Careers program on careers for a sustainable world on 4/24 and an Earth Day screen printing workshop on 4/22.

Another great spring program will be a preview of Edgewood Natural Preserve on 4/12.

In April and May, the Downtown Library will be hosting the *Lost Childhoods Art Exhibit*, an evocative display that sheds light on the struggles faced by foster youth in the child welfare system. There will be several programs associated with this exhibition:

- 4/14 at 6 p.m.: California's Forgotten Children Documentary and Discussion
- 4/18 at 5 p.m.: Living Out Loud: A Night of Spoken Word
